Role Responsibilities:

- **Research:** Analyse policy and data on Australia–Indo-Pacific issues.
- **Communications:** Create digital content for web, social media, and newsletters.
- **Event Management:** Assist with logistics, speaker coordination, and attendee management.
- **Stakeholder Engagement:** Including outreach, maintenance and performance tracking.
- **Representation:** Represent the Centre at dialogues and events, capturing key messages.

Desired Skills:

- Excellent writing and communication abilities.
- Strong research and analytical skills.
- Organized and proactive, capable of handling multiple tasks under tight deadlines.
- Digital literacy, including familiarity with CMS, social media, databases, and analytics.
